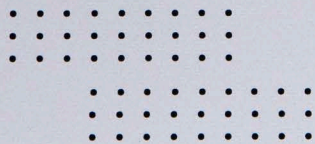

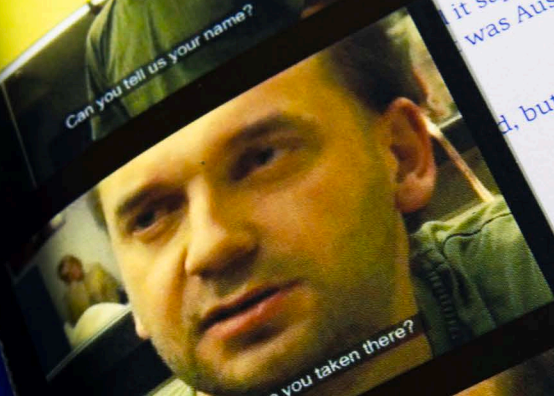

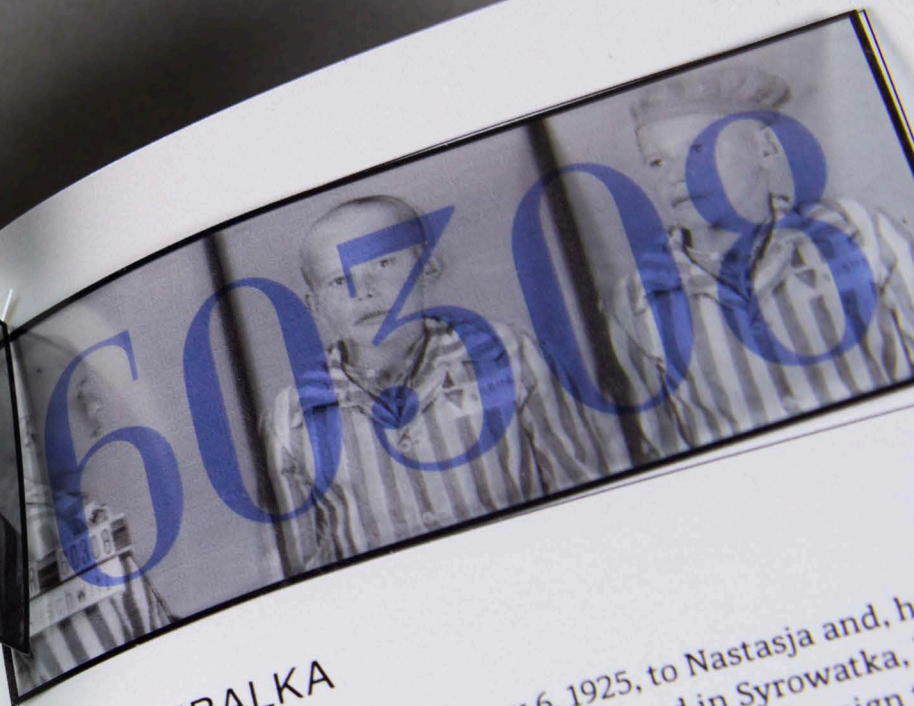

WALTER DEGEN

Walter Degen (nr 20285) was born on 4 January 1909 in Mörchingen between 1871 - 1918 Mörchingen was located in Germany, today it is a commune called Morhangt in North East France. Walter was a locksmith. He was transported to the camp within a group of 21 prisoners deported by the Stapo and Kipo from Vienna, Brünn, Prague, Troppau, Breslau, Schwerin, Frankfurt an der Oder and Kattowitz. They were registered in the camp on 29 August 1941. Walter Degen was registered both as a homosexual and a German political prisoner.

In Auschwitz, prisoners of German nationality and "parasites" for "criminals" were arrested under Paragraph 175.



IWAN REBALKA

Iwan Rebalka was born on February 6, 1925, to Nastasja and, Maksym Rybalka. At the time, the family lived in Syrowatka, Krasnopilla, Russland—an area which is now the sovereign Ukraine. According to documents recovered from KL Auschwitz he belonged to the Greek Orthodox Church and was a milkman when he was arrested in Bielowody, Kreis Myropilla, Russland.

Iwan and 56 other individuals were deported to the camp on 20, 1942. Once there, he was registered as a prisoner with the number 60308. All told, an estimated 100,000 — were sent to the camp.
