On Monday morning, October 19, 1969, Robert Steiner and I
moved our painting equipment into unoccupied rooms behind the
snack bar to demonstrate our need as junior painters for adequate
school studio space. We were joined by Abby Rorer, Kristen Johnson, and Jo Ann Wojtech. We have continued to paint in these empty
rooms under much duress as we wish to make it evident to students,
faculty and administration that our need is immediate and it is
urgent that our demands be recognized.

During the last three weeks Kristen Johnson and Day Gleeson have conferred with Mr. Peers concerning the possibility of keeping the College Building opened longer hours to utilize the studio space now available and to voice concern over the evident lack of space in proportion to the number of the junior painters. They were then referred to and spoke with Mr. Hamilton, Dean Lay, Mr. Richardson, Mr. Ashcraft, buildings and grounds, Mr. Belhumeur and graduate painting students in an effort to locate adequate painting space. After having exhausted administrative possibilities and ultimately being referred back to Mr. Peers and the painting department, it became apparent the consensus of all these discussions was that they could accomplish nothing for the junior painting department without the voiced support of the junior painters.
