ASSAULT: IT CAN HAPPEN TO YOU!

Personal safety is a major concern for all RISD students-both male and female. As Director of Student Development and Counseling, I have been told by many students of both sexes about assaults which directly involved them or their friends. In response to the increasing concerns over personal security, the Student Affairs Office is offering during Wintersession a course on Women's Self Defense and two presentations by the Rape Crisis Center and the Providence Police Department: on February 2 for students who live in campus residences, and on February 5 for students who live off-campus. Valuable information for both men and women will be given. If you want to be better informed about your safety, please attend one of the assault presentations. If you want to sign up for a spring Self Defense Class, come to the S.A.O. If student interest merits, a coed class will be offered.

If you are sexually attacked or an attempt is made, I urge you to call the Rape Crisis Center's 24-hour hotline: 861-4040. A trained volunteer will counsel you, anonymously if you prefer, and provide you with confidential support and even meet you at the hospital or police station.

It is essential that any RISD student who is attacked reports the incident as soon as possible to the Security Office (331-3511, extension 250) or to me in the Student Affairs Office (331-3511, extension 230). You may give the report anonymously. Reporting these incidents is extremely important if we are to continue to improve our security. Also, if you report the crime to my office, I can provide you with support and help you reach sources of legal advice and personal counseling.

A DIFFERENT SUMMER JOB

Have trouble locating a summer job? Try the field of nursing. Take a look in the classified ads and you're sure to find several openings in nursing homes. Many positions are often open: housekeepers, kitchen workers, nurse's aides and orderlies. Though many places require some experience, many are willing to train you and once you have some experience, you can find a job almost anywhere in the country. Also, you have a selection of the time of day you want to work: 7AM-3PM, 3PM-11PM, or 11PM-7A. The pay is usually minimum wage or above. And, contrary to popular opinion, nursing homes are not depressing places to work in.

If you don't feel you would be comfortable in a nursing home situation, there are also nursing agencies. If you are hired by an agency such as Quality Care or Kelly Health Care, you specify what hours and days you are available and the agency calls you with job offers. You have the option to accept or refuse, without fearing that they won't call again. There are usually two positions open to inexperienced people: homemakers, which consists of going to the person's home and performing light housekeeping tasks, or a nurse's aides, which usually means helping the person dress and wash. The pay varies, so check around. If you would like more information about a summer job in the nursing field, leave a note in Box #135.
